Rules:

USGA Rules govern play.

If the OB are stakes are put back on #2 and #16 Local Rules are not in play. If you hit it out of bounds you must re hit from the original spot. Stroke and distance penalty.

In the event of a question as to how to proceed a player may play 2 balls per USGA Rule #3-3 but he must use the following procedure.

- 1. Announce to a competitor the intention to play a second ball.
- 2. Announce which ball he wants to score with if the rules permit.
- 3. Report all facts to the Committee unless both balls are the same score.

Ties will be broken using the recommended USGA card matching procedures.

Format:

- This is a 4 Man Team event <u>and</u> an Individual Event played at 100% handicap.
- 3 or 4 person teams. Each golfer on a team plays his own ball throughout the round. On each hole, a predetermined number of the low scores is used, and combined for one team score.
- For example, golfers A, B, C and D make up a 1-2-3 Best Ball team. On the first hole, all four golfers tee off and each plays his own ball into the hole. The one low score among the four counts as the team score.
- On the second hole, all four play their balls into the hole, but on Hole No. 2, the two low scores count as the team score. So if the four individual scores were 5, 7, 4 and 6, the team score for Hole 2 is 9 (because 4 and 5 were the two low scores).
- On Hole No. 3, the three low scores combine to create the team score. If the four golfers had individual scores of 4, 5, 6 and 7, the team score for Hole 3 is 15 (4+5+6). And on Hole No. 4, it's back to the one low score. Scorekeeping rotates in this fashion throughout the round, until the 18th where all 4 balls count for the team score.
- The winning team will be the team with the lowest team net score (as defined above) and will qualify for the TOC.
- Record each player's **<u>GROSS SCORE</u>** on the official scorecard.
- If you only have 3 players you are allowed to play as a 3 player team.
- If the numbers work out, on the last hole all 4 players scores will be used. If there is an uneven numbers of players the tournament committee may use a blind draw to select a player from the field to even the numbers up, or continue using the 1, 2, 3 best ball formula.
